A U.S. judge in December told Shell's U.S. law to give Esther Kiobel documents about Shell's activities in Nigeria, according to her lawyers a court transcript obtained by protest website royaldutchshellplc.com and seen by Reuters.

Kiobel's Dutch lawyer, Channa Samkalden, said the Dutch civil case would be filed in the next coup months. Any damages are likely to be immateri for Shell, analysts said, as Dutch courts rarely make the kinds of multi-million dollar awards common in the United States.
